The El Dorado County General Plan requires that the Economic Element be updated and approved every four years. The El Dorado County Board of Supervisors requested that their Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) move forward with the development of community based committees to allow all of us to have a say in how the El Dorado County General Plan will be implemented for our respective areas. This process has taken the perceived deals made in the “Back Room” and moved them into the “Front Room” to provide transparency and facilitate wide spread public involvement.

With the encouragement of EDAC, El Dorado Hills has formed its own local Community Economic Development Advisory Committee, CEDAC-EDH with boundaries contained within the 95762 zip code. This 11 member group of coordinators is made up of EDH resident leaders who have been involved with many diverse groups and organizations within El Dorado Hills and throughout El Dorado County.

It is the groups hope that many El Dorado Hills residents will get involved as local meetings take place. The meetings will address a variety of subjects such as Community Needs and Visioning, Parks and Recreation, Traffic Mitigation, Business and Job Creation and Retention, Housing, Senior Programs, Historic Preservation and more.

On April 18<sup>th</sup> you will have an opportunity to meet the community coordinators, understand the structure of future meetings, determine topics for discussion, and learn how your input will make a difference in long range planning.

This is a once in a lifetime opportunity for us to determine the future of El Dorado Hills. We can do this together as the EDH Community or we can leave it to County staff to do it for us. Please consider getting involved now, by adding your voice to the discussions or volunteering to work on one of the subcommittees. We need your ideas/ involvement to establish the community based recommendations that the Board of Supervisors will adopt as part of the General Plan update.
